Letter from Councilwoman Jeannine Pearce

Dear Neighbors,

As many have heard, our city, county and state have made bold steps to flatten the curve of COVID-19. We know things are changing day by day, hour by hour and minute by minute. Each of us have been asked to meet this moment and do what is best for the greater whole. This is how we will demonstrate human kindness to exceed expectations and survive. These decisions reflect both the enormity of our current reality, our deep sense of responsibility and concern for our community. It's moments like these where we need to embrace science and do what we know will work.

Truly it's moments like these where we unite to overcome the impossible and rise stronger for the long haul. Please know that your city continues working around the clock to ensure you have a safe, healthy community for all. These times are not easy, yet we remain focused on delivering progress.

My team's priority is to make sure you have support. Randy continues to lead our trauma resilience support and is available to coordinate any online outreach with you and your neighbors. We are working to strengthen this bond closely alongside the Mayor's office to launch a Neighbor to Neighbor support network. ## Housing and History Rose Park

Who and When did Rose Park Neighborhood start?

1909 – The area was acquired by the City of Long Beach – East Seventh Street Annexation

1910 – Rose Park was deeded to the City by the Alamitos Land Company


1913 - A citation in the local newspaper dated June 17, 1913 documents that the first action of the Board of the Rose Park Club was to pave a portion of 7th Street. Got to love this!!!

Jump to

1970's – Effort to make E7th into cross town freeway is stopped by residents 1980's – Sees a change in land use with neighborhood responding with the beginning of house meetings.

1988-89 - Formation of Rose Park Neighborhood with Jim Dohn as first president. 1997 – City enacts an ordinance establishing Rose Park Historic District.

2001 – City enacts an ordinance establishing Rose Park South Historic District.
2005 – Rose Park Neighborhood Association incorporates as a 501 c 3 non-profit which it remains today.



As is clear by the timeline. There are several steps to forming a neighborhood. And there are many people. There is no single founder. In fact, many groups of residents came together over time to further the goals based on needs. Today we are looking forward to resident oriented development such as Safe Streets, Green Spaces, Walkability and

affordable housing where properly scaled businesses and non-profit organizations can thrive.

Workshops have been a key element of each event hosted by Rose Park Neighborhood Association, Long Beach Skate Co., and Revive Church. 


Community members create a 'zine' at the Parking Lot Skate Jam in November 2019

builds with community organizations such as Power4Youth, Safe Refuge, Mental Health America, and Action Sports Kids Foundation.




Parking Lot Skate Jam attendees construct mini-skate ramps donated by Keen Ramps Warehouse LB in January 2020

"All Hands on Deck" mosaic art project created at The Parking Lot Skate Jam in March 2019






