

ROSE PARK

The historic Rose Park neighborhood is located in the City of Long Beach, California and just blocks from the beautiful Pacific Ocean between Cherry and Redondo Avenues to the west and east; and 4th and 10th Streets to the south and north. The Rose Park Historic District gains its name from the small circular park on Orizaba Avenue at the intersection of 8th Street. The park was donated to the city in 1910 by the Alamitos Land Company.

Rose Park and Rose Park South historic districts contain beautiful craftsman and bungalow homes on tree lined streets reflecting the architecture of early Long Beach, from the turn of the century to the 1920s. Over 5,000 people reside here, and within the past few years the neighborhood has witnessed a resurgence in restoration and civic pride motivated in large part by the efforts of the Rose Park Neighborhood Association (RPNA).

The **RPNA** was formed in 1999 to:

- Foster cooperation, communication and pride among residents of the area.
- Create a positive identity for Rose Park throughout Long Beach and beyond.
- Encourage an understanding of citizenship and civic responsibility.
- Promote an appreciation for the neighborhood's architectural history and its preservation.
- To increase the quality of life in our neighborhood.
